General Rules of Engagement:

- Employees who commute from state to state to report to home office or regular job site are exempt from strict adherence to these guidelines and associated policies, however a general awareness should apply, and participation should be put in place when appropriate.
- Voluntary or nonessential travel remains prohibited, unless with executive approval.
- Managers must weigh the overall risk of moving resources, including for emergency response activities. Decisions about movement of employees within the network must involve a conversation with appropriate management/personnel.
- Managers should know where their people are, set expectations for traveling employees, and oversee adherence of guidelines.
- Large, multi-regional responses (Casualty Response, MEMT) are recognized to be highly complex and dynamic operations. The same guidelines above shall apply, but certain government agencies may dictate protocol.

Activity Hazard Analysis has been updated to reflect these guidelines and is dated August 1,2020. AHA can be found in the Brand Toolkit in MAST and in the secure COVID-19 Employee Link. Health and Safety has also updated the COVID-Procedures When Notified which outlines return to work procedures including a Fit for Duty exam for field employees.
